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

Throughout the Autumn months, progress on Gascoigne East has continued at pace. The most advanced homes are within Arbor Court which are starting to be decorated, carpets laid, and heating systems switched on.

At Fleming Court, Shuckford Court, Leleu Court and Mather Court we are currently at the roof level which is our 10th floor. We have recently started the internal walls and brickwork on these 159 new homes.

Work is progressing well on Cutter Court, Fifeshire Court, Forge Court and Whennel Court, which will provide 215 new homes and seven commercial or retail spaces. Heading towards the festive season, the site alongside Abbey Road is now entering its final stages and remains on track for completion next April.

We have been working on the outside of the blocks and landscaping, with trees being planted in the New Year. More balconies are being added, and the remaining scaffolding and crane will be coming down by the end of December, so more of the 201 much-needed homes will be revealed.

Big steps forward

More park life



Residents will be able to enjoy a new park next year thanks to a project involving local students at Greatfields School.

The park will transform the 'castle' play area on Dovehouse Mead that has been unsafe and fenced off for years.

New designs from architects HTA Design have been unveiled following a series of design workshops with 20 Year 10 students from the school. The workshops included site visits, ideas generation, an introduction to circular economy and what can be recycled from the demolition of sites, design development, costing up plans and finalising priorities to accommodate all residents of Gascoigne to create an inclusive space.

Crystal Sterling, Assistant Head Teacher at Greatfields, said: "Our students thoroughly enjoyed the experience and the opportunities to meet and work on various different parts of a construction project. The students are so proud of what they designed and are thrilled that their hard work and ideas will be injected back into their local community."

Jennie Coombs, Head of Affordable Housing at Be First, said: "The project has been important to us to ensure that young people are part of the changes that are happening in their neighbourhood and to ensure that we are creating spaces they want to see and be in."

Builders Wilmott Dixon are now programming works to build the new park which is scheduled to be finished in Spring next year.

The citation for the prize reads that without Sadia's humble approach and passion for engaging residents, the pocket park would not have been built.

Sadia said: "I am absolutely delighted to receive this award. The success of the park has been a team effort and I want to pay due to the commitment, input and passion from local residents including the Gascoigne Residents Forum who have co-created this park. This award is for them."

Council to decide on hundreds more homes next year

Plans to build 446 homes, a new community centre, playgrounds and tree-lined streets and courtyards have been submitted to the Council for a final decision next year.

The new homes in the Coverdales and Ripple Road areas of the Gascoigne feature one to four-bedroom homes and family-friendly town houses with rents as low as £168 a week.

The new plans include a new greenway and garden courtyards. The new community centre at the corner of St Pauls Road and Ripple Road will host a range of services and also feature a roof terrace and viewing platform.

What's happening in your area?

What's happening in Gascoigne West

All three phases of development on this side of the area are now ready for development or have construction underway.

Building work on Phase 1 is well underway – 201 new homes with rents from £137 per week. We'll be planting more trees and improving the public spaces. Phoenix Park the community co-designed pop up park is open and being enjoyed by local residents.

And building work on phase 2 has also started which will deliver 386 new homes for local people. Work is due to be completed in March 2024.

This phase of redevelopment was completed in March 2019 and all the homes are now occupied. The Gascoigne Community Centre has now moved to its temporary home in the unit under Lariat Court until its permanent home in Phase 2 is completed.

Demolition has been completed. Construction is underway on the first homes and further phases will start over the next year. The first homes will be ready in autumn 2022.

Phase 3A and 3B East

Phase 3A has demolition underway and the construction of 200 new homes will commence in early 2022. Phase 3B has rehousing still ongoing.

Moving home

Residents are still moving from Phase 3B and this will continue till mid 2022. If you live in this phase you should have been contacted by a Be First Rehousing Co-ordinator to assist with your move.

Phase 4 is a large phase that will be handled block by block. The first blocks in phase 4 to be rehoused will be Earlsdown and Oban House and this will commence in December 2021. If you live in these blocks a Rehousing Co-ordinator will contact you in due course.
