Formative Assessment - Q3 on the Migration Paper ^{Damaris Porobantu}
Compare Huguenot migration with Jewish migration to Britain.
In what ways were they similar? Explain your answer with reference to both groups of people

Both groups of people
Huguenots were faced religious discrimination and therefore had no choice but to migrate to Britain. In the 17th century, France had signed the Edict of Nantes which allowed French protestants to live freely within France which was established as a dominant Catholic country. However this ~~act~~ ^{later} law was revoked in 1685 (Huguenots) which meant thousands of French protestants were forced to leave their country and migrate to Britain as they were no longer legally protected and could face harsh discrimination. Similarly, during late 18th - 19th century, 5 million Jewish people were forced to migrate to Britain away from Russia. The Russia protected other christian denominations, although majority Orthodox Christian, however Jews were not protected and were subject to discrimination such as the cruelty of being segregated from others and forced labour. Jewish people had to feel obligated to leave Russia and migrate to Britain in order to have a proper quality of life ~~without~~ ^{and} be able to sustain themselves without the constant and frequent discrimination.
